## About the Course

The **HLT33115, Certificate III in Health Services Assistance**, covers workers in a range of work roles who provide assistance to health professional staff with the care of clients. Health Services Assistants work with direct client contact but under supervision.

The curriculum for this qualification has been structured with elective groups for specific work functions in assisting nursing work in acute care. Additionally, the qualification supports the multi-skilling requirements of smaller, rural, or remote work settings.

This qualification is suited to Australian Apprenticeship pathways.

The course is provided through Blended mode of delivery. It will be delivered over 714 hours including 352 hours of theory and tutorials, 120 hours of simulation-based training and assessment, 60 hours of structured interactive learning (SIL), and 80 hours of Professional Experience Placement (PEP).

This course follows Competency-based training which is the concept that individuals learn at different rates as well as through different modes and different environments and that the skills and knowledge that a student has acquired previously are able to be formally recognised.

## Mode of Delivery

### Blended Delivery

**(Blended: Online real-time theory tutorials with on-campus skills training in a simulation environment)**

Students must attend 20 hours of classes per week. This includes simulation-based assessments and professional experience placements.

20 contact hours per week will be delivered through synchronised online learning, which includes on-campus simulation-based training and professional experience placements.

In addition to structured learning, students should plan for approximately 10 hours per week of unstructured learning.

Students must meet additional requirements for professional experience placements (PEP), such as obtaining a clear police check, working with children check, and necessary immunisations.

Simulation-based assessment (1 to 2 weeks on campus) and Professional Placement (80 hours, approximately 3 to 4 weeks) are mandatory.

## Entry Requirements

There are no pre-requisites or any other training package entry requirements for this course.

### IHNA Admission Criteria

- IHNA has in place admission criteria for courses in its scope as required by its 'Application and Enrolment Procedure for VET Courses' to ensure that candidates meet industry requirements.
- Applicants are required to be 18 years' old

- Successful completion of an Australian Year 10 qualification or equivalent.

*Note: Mature age students (22+) may also be considered without the minimum education requirements. Each case will be reviewed individually to ascertain the capacity of the applicant to meet qualification requirements.*

- In addition, all the applicants are required to have successfully completed an ACSF test and demonstrate competence as working at Level 3 for all indicators to enroll for this qualification (issued within the last 12 months from the time of admission).

### Additional Requirement for professional experience placement.

- A satisfactory National Police Clearance / Australian Federal Police Clearance Certificate (AFP).
- Working with Children Check (WWCC)
- IHNA highly recommends students to complete the immunization process before the Professional Experience Placement start date as some facilities will not provide placement to student without immunisation.
- It is also essential for the student to possess basic computer skills.

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Where a student breaches the above requirements, they could be excluded from their practical placements which may result in unsuccessful completion of the course.
