This qualification reflects the role of workers who provide services to clients in relation to mental health issues. They can provide counselling, referral, advocacy, and education and health promotion services. These workers are required to have high-level specialist knowledge, skills, and competencies, especially in regard to laws affecting people with mental health issues, the range of services available to them, and health issues related to mental health.

To achieve this qualification, the candidate must have completed at least 160 hours of work as detailed in the Assessment Requirements of units of competency. No licensing, legislative, regulatory, or certification requirements apply to this qualification at the time of publication.

This course follows Competency-based training which is the concept that individuals learn at different rates as well as through different modes and different environments and that the skills and knowledge that a student has acquired previously are able to be formally recognised.

Mode of Delivery

Blended Delivery

20 contact hours per week will be delivered through synchronised Online learning which includes on- campus simulation based training and Professional Experience Placement.

Besides the above structured learning, students are advised that they will be required to do approximate 10 hours per week of un-structured learning.

The blended delivery mode is only available to domestic students on selected campuses and subject to eligibility.

Students must meet additional requirements for Professional Experience Placements as required such as a clear police check, working with children check & immunisations.

Entry Requirements

- 18 years of age and above at the time of commencement of the course
- Satisfactory completion of studies in applicant's home country equivalent to an Australian Year 12 qualification.
- IELTS band score of 5.5 or equivalent
- Apart from the above entry requirements, students are expected to have a numeracy score of Australian Core Skills Framework (ACSF) at level 3. (Language, literacy, and numeracy (LLN) test will be conducted during orientation)

Upon successful completion of all the required units of competency, students will be issued a testamur with record of results.
